

The First IEEE International European Workshop on Prognostics and Health Management for Engineering and Computer Systems ([PHM-ECS 2020](#))

Macau, China, December 11-14, 2020

The objective of this workshop is to provide researchers and practitioners with an open forum for presenting and discussing their ideas and experiences with technologies, theories, and tools used for conducting Prognostics and Health Management of Engineering and Computer Systems.

Submission

Authors are invited to submit original, unpublished research papers as well as industrial practice papers. Simultaneous submissions to other conferences are not permitted. The length of a camera ready paper will be limited to eight pages, including the title of the paper, the name and affiliation of each author, a 150-word abstract, and up to 6 keywords. Shorter papers (up to four pages) and industry presentation (with only PowerPoint slides) are also allowed.

Authors must follow the IEEE Computer Society Press Proceedings Author Guidelines to prepare their papers. At least one of the authors of each accepted paper is required to pay full registration fee and present the paper at the workshop. Arrangements are being made to publish selected accepted papers in reputable

Ei and SCI indexed journals. Submissions must be in PDF format and uploaded to the conference submission site.
